RE - How do people from religious and non-religious communities celebrate key festivals?

<u>Maths</u> children will complete the mass and capacity unit, before going into greater depth with fractions, using reasoning and maths oracy to explore problem solving and deepen their maths mastery. Students will start to explore decimals, through money, before revisiting time, both analogue and digital.

Art – Festival Feasts

Responding to creative stimulus, pupils will use multimedia to make an individual artwork which contributes to a larger shared piece.

<u>PE -</u> Pupils will use running, jumping, striking, play competitive games, and apply basic principles suitable for tennis. Develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance PE is on Tuesdays & Thursdays—PE kit please!

Music Body and tuned percussion – theme- Rainforests.

<u>Geography</u>- Why are jungles so wet and deserts so dry? Throughout the enquiry, pupils are encouraged to reflect upon how climate has such an important influence upon landscapes, plants, animals and human activity on Earth.

Homework: Using supervised online research, pupils will produce a short report about a coniferous forest. Pupils are to describe and explain how plants and animals are adapted to the climate of the forest. A possible structure could be: Location (with map); Images to illustrate the characteristics of the environment; Climate; Common animals and plants; Examples of adaptation.

In green, we have suggested some ideas to support your child's learning at home.





<u>Science</u> -Plants Identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants: roots; stem/trunk; leaves; and flowers. Pupils will explore the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow) and how they vary from plant to plant. Children will investigate the way in which water is transported within plants and explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

English Inspired by Jack and the Dreamsack, children will write a fantasy story, effectively using adverbials, prepositional phrases with conjunctions, expanded noun phrases and correctly punctuated direct speech. For their non-fiction text, pupils will use layout and subheadings, alongside previous skills to write an informative text of their choice, based on The Big Book of Blooms, by Yuval Zommer.
