

Geography – Why is fair trade fair?

Trade exemplifies for young geographers, in an accessible way, the interconnectedness and interdependence of the world in which they live.

Art – Mechanical systems – Pop-up book.

Create a functional four-page pop-up storybook design, using levers, sliders, layers and spacers to create paper-based mechanisms.

Music – Children are introduced to musical theatre, learning how singing, acting and dancing can be combined to give a performance.

PE – Pupils will know how to dribble a hockey ball, pass effectively in a team – and in unopposed situations using the push-pass technique. They will demonstrate a push shot correctly and effective movement in and out of space. At the end of the unit, pupils will play a competitive hockey match using correct rules. PE kit days: Wednesday and Friday

Maths This term pupils study percentage and decimals, building on prior number knowledge and flexibility to apply understanding of place value to new learning. This unit leads into the measurement unit, in which they will be converting units, and applying their understanding to real-life situations to embed learning and practice problem solving and reasoning skills.

Science – The unit Earth and Space continues, giving children the opportunity to describe the movement of the Earth and other planets, relative to the sun in the solar system. Pupils will describe the movement of the moon relative to the Earth and describe the sun, Earth, and moon as approximately spherical bodies.

PSHE - Our theme this half term is 'Healthy Me', in which pupils learn about being healthy and keeping safe.

Computing – in this unit, learners will use physical computing to explore the concept of selection in programming through the use of the Crumble.

Homework Project – Pupils ask every member of their home to sort out their five favourite pieces of clothing. The pupils can then make a tally chart of the companies that have made each item of clothing and the country in which it was manufactured. They can then choose one of the companies and research online whether it makes any commitment to ensuring its clothes are produced ethically and, if so, how. Due by Friday 22nd March

Back in class the pupils will pool their data, present it graphically and also on a map of the world.

Woodland Learning – The natural world has inspired artists for generations. Large or small, colourful, or plain, textured, or smooth, can nature inspire you to create a piece of transient art in your outdoor space?

English Taking inspiration from Malorie Blackman's poetry *Cloud Busting*, pupils will develop higher level language skills to convey complicated concepts concisely. They will use punctuation accurately to avoid ambiguity and they will indicate parenthesis using dashes.
